The Old National Road

- ❖ Authorized by President Thomas Jefferson in 1806
- ❖ Indiana's section began in 1827 in Richmond, Indiana and progressed 160 miles to Terre Haute, Indiana
 - ❖ The cost was a ½ million dollars in the 19th century
- ❖ Heavily used by pioneers heading west and farmers going to market
- ❖ Use of the road diminished due to the railroad, but made a huge return at the beginning of the 20th century with the invention of automobiles
- ❖ Today, the National Road is known as Highway 40, and provides a relaxing drive down memory lane as it passes through the heart of many Indiana small towns

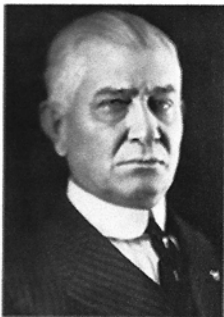

Samuel M. Ralston



- **Birth:** Dec. 1, 1857, New Cumberland, Tuscarawas County, Ohio
- **Death:** Oct. 14, 1925, Indianapolis, Marion County
- **Burial:** Oak Hill Cemetery, Lebanon, Boone County, Indiana, USA
- **Indiana State Governor, US Senator.** He moved to Spencer, Indiana in 1865, graduated from the Central Normal College in 1884, studied law, was admitted to the bar in 1886 and began to practice law in Lebanon, Indiana. He was presidential elector on the Democratic ticket, (1888, 1892) and president of the Lebanon School Board, (1908-11). In 1913, he was elected 28th Indiana Governor and served until 1917. After his term, he resumed the practice of law and was elected as a Democrat to the United States Senate in 1923 and served until his death at age 67 in Indianapolis, Indiana.

- **Burial:** Crown Hill Cemetery, Indianapolis

- **Indianapolis Mayor.** Served as the Mayor of Indianapolis, Indiana, from 1901 to 1903, and 1906 to 1910.
Served as a Candidate for the Indiana State House of Representatives in 1886.
